The percentage of single-race American Indians and Alaska Natives age 5 and older in North Carolina who spoke a language other than English at home in 2015, compared with 11.5 percent for the state as a whole.

Education

The percentage of the North Carolina American Indian and Alaska Native population, alone or in combination, age 25 and older that had at least a high school diploma, GED certificate or alternative credential in 2014. In addition, 17.6 percent obtained a bachelor's degree or higher. In comparison, 86.6 percent of the overall population age 25 and older had a high school diploma or higher, and 29.5 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher.

The percentage of single-race American Indians and Alaska Natives age 25 and older with a bachelor's degree or higher whose degree was in science and engineering, or science and engineering-related fields in 2015. This compares with 43.7 percent for all people age 25 and older with a bachelor's degree or higher in science and engineering, or science and engineering-related fields in 2015.

The percentage of single-race American Indians and Alaska Natives age 25 and older who had a bachelor's, graduate or professional degree in 2015.

In addition, 22.0 percent worked in service occupations and 18.4 percent in sales and office occupations, 18.9 percent worked in natural resources, construction and maintenance operation and 17.3% worked in production, transportation and material moving occupations.
