What are domestic violence intervention programs?

- Designed to educate offenders on their behavior and help them develop new methods of interacting with intimate partners, family members, and their communities.
- 26 weeks long; virtual or in-person, depending on program¹
- 38 service providers working in 63 counties
- 25 counties have access to programs in Spanish

Who participated?




Of those referred, **1,837** people were accepted & enrolled

1,743 people completed the program → 92.5% men & 7.5% women

819 victim service providers were contacted by programs

Offenders Ordered to Complete Domestic Violence Intervention Programs

Numbers indicate judge-ordered assignment to complete counseling program, but may not reflect number of programs successfully completed.



1. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, service providers transitioned to offering virtual programs for the first time. Some service providers were entirely closed for parts of the reporting period. 2. About 2.8% of referrals came from mental health providers and self-referrals, and are not shown on this chart.
