Culturally Responsive Teaching about American Indians

Culturally responsive instruction is a philosophy and accompanying implementation of instruction that purposefully acknowledges, embraces and uses what each student brings culturally to the classroom in order for all students to have equitable access to the learning content. It is built on a foundation of relationships and respect. Culturally responsive teaching is one strategy identified by the NC State Advisory Council on Indian Education (SACIE) and others to address issues in student performance. The mission of this module, developed by SACIE and NCDPI, is to promote culturally responsive teaching about American Indians among educators in North Carolina. This module should take approximately 10 hours to complete and is worth 1.0 CEU on successful completion.
