Vice Dean of UNC-Chapel Hill Gillings School of Global Public Health



Barbara K. Rimer, MPH, DrPH, is the dean of the UNC-Chapel Hill Gillings School of Global Public Health. She is also an alumni distinguished professor of health behavior at UNC-Chapel Hill. Previously, Dr. Rimer served as director of the Division of Cancer Control and Population Sciences at the National Cancer Institute (1997-2002); professor of community and family medicine at Duke University (1991-1997); and director of behavioral research and a full member at the Fox Chase Cancer Center in Philadelphia (1981-1991). She has conducted research in several areas with a focus on reducing risk for cancer and assuring early detection of cancers.

Dr. Rimer is the author of over 270 peer-reviewed articles, 55 book chapters and six books, and serves on several journal editorial boards. She was the first woman and

behavioral scientist to lead the National Cancer Institute's National Cancer Advisory Board, a presidential appointment and was elected to the Institute of Medicine in 2008. In 2011, she was appointed by President Obama to chair the President's Cancer Panel. She has received many awards including, in 2013, the American Cancer Society's Medal of Honor for her cancer control research.
