

### **HUB Office Overview**



The Office for Historically Underutilized Businesses promotes diversity and inclusion in state government procurement and contracting.

#### The main roles of the HUB Office include:

- HUB Certification
- NC Small Business Enterprise Certification
- Support the use of Historically Underutilized Businesses and NCSBEs
- Business Development services to HUBs/NCSBEs
- Providing training to HUB vendors and the state and local governments
- Collecting reports on construction spending and goods/services purchases



### What is a HUB?



• Per NC General Statute 143-128.4


• At least 51% of business is <u>owned</u> by one or more persons who are members of at least one of the groups in 143-128.4 (b).

• The <u>management</u> and daily business operations must be <u>controlled</u> by at least one owner in one of the groups in 143-128.4 (b).

## HUB Certifications Over Time July 2017 to July 2021






Total new certifications and recertifications approved has increased each year since FY 17-18. (Over 1,000 approved so far in FY 21-22)


FY 21-22 has the highest average monthly number of certifications or recertifications in the last five years. (151 per month in FY 21-22)

Put People First, Ensure Sustainability of Efforts, Make Efforts Adaptable to Change, Ensure Transparency and Accountability


#### **Subcommittees:**

### RETOOLNC Grant Program





RETOOLNC Grant Program created as a response to Executive Order 143 Addressing the Disproportionate Impact of COVID-19 on Communities of Color

- Total Grant Funds Distributed: \$21,067,255.76
- Total grant applications approved: 1,124
- Grant Size Range: \$10,000 to \$25,000 per firm

#### Eligibility Criteria included:

- Independent for-profit business in operation since 2019
- Certified as Historically Underutilized Business or Dept. of Transportation Disadvantaged Business Enterprise
- 50 employees or less
- Annual Gross Revenues: \$1,500,000 or less

## Minority Business Development Agency




 HUB Office awarded 5-Year award from the US Department of Commerce

- Funding is to establish a business center to aid North Carolina minority business enterprise firms
- MBDA business centers provide minority-owned firms a platform to reach global and domestic markets, enhancing growth, access to capital, contract opportunities and assistance in identifying strategic partners

## Construction HUB Participation






- Total HUB Spending Reported in FY 20-21: \$204,665,108
- Highest HUB dollar value on record for Construction in NC
- Over \$50 million higher than prior Fiscal Year
- 55 entities reporting 10% participation or more


## FY 21-22 HUB Construction Spending By Agency Category As of February 14, 2022






### FY 21-22 HUB Construction Spending By Certification Category As of February 14, 2022






## FY 21-22 HUB Design Spending By Agency Category As of February 14, 2022
